Detailed description of project

The Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh is in the process of receiving \$170,000,000 in financing from the Asian Development Bank for infrastructure construction and capacity development in 53 local governments. The City Region Development Project (CRDP) was conceived to assess and develop capacity of local governments, then provide financial investment payments to cities and towns which have developed and demonstrated improvements in their institutional capacity and ability to manage the planning, budgeting, procurement and financial management of infrastructure once it is in place. The Municipal Capacity Development (MCD) component was designed to assess and improve governance and institutional capacity in 25 cities, towns and regional governments.

Total Contract Amount: €41,480 (\$56,000 USD)

The Project focuses on 3 areas: resource mobilization, citizen participation, and urban planning. MCD is designed to:

- a) assess institutional capacity of 23 local governments (City Centers, Pourashavas and Urban Centers),
- a) develop unique change management & capacity development plans for the same 23 local governments;

Type of services provided by the legal entity

- b) provide hands-on change management and capacity development training, and
- c) improve the performance of local governments, specifically in the areas of municipal funding (tax assessment & collection), financial management, organizational efficiency, urban planning, development of public-private partnership, and increase community mobilization and participation in local government.

MCD also includes change management and capacity development of local professional staff, local oversight boards, commissions and elected officials resulting in better funded local governments, better managed, more efficient in service delivery, and effectively engaged with local residents and businesses.

Detailed description of project

The EU-funded Change Management and capacity building program for the Iraqi Council of Representatives (Parliament). This project is a two-year program designed to enhance the institutional and human capacity to effectively create a permanent training unit within the Parliament necessary to serve its 317-member Parliament. This initiative addresses 8 directorates in all 8 political blocks, 7 offices, 26 committees, and approximately 1212 employees accomplish the following overall result:

- Build a professional, non-partisan and flexible human resources regime within the administrative arm of Parliament,
- Establish a fully functioning Training Unit enabled to coordinate and administrate training activities for CoR employees.
- Provide a means of expanding and coordinating training and human resource development across directorates,
- Provide important linkages across the CoR Secretariat by coordinating training priorities and assisting
 in the identification of training needs.
- Assist in coordinating activities between the CoR Secretariat and the Presidency Council by serving as
 a focal point for both staff and MP training
- Build internal support the processes and procedures necessary for a fully functioning Parliament.

Total Contract Amount: €17,850 (\$24,097 USD)

- Conducted a programmatic audit / assessment of the current internal institutional and personnel capacities and to developed a fully-functional (permanent) training unit within the Council of Representatives (Parliament);
